Merry Christmas!

Here is a brief recap of our 2024... even though this is the first time ever that the *Bihl Bugle* has turned into a 3-pager instead of a 2-pager!

Some of the highlights of our year included a Spring Break trip to Missouri to visit Amy's relatives (aunt and uncle, Cendy and Taylor, cousin Joshua and his family, grandfather Jim, and great-aunt Donna on the 121-year-old Hardy farm in S.W. City). We toured Grand Falls (aka Shoal Creek Falls), other familiar Joplin and Carthage sites, and also stopped at the Cherokee National Research Center in Tahlequah, OK. Amy's great-great-aunt Ruth Muskrat Bronson's dress that she wore to meet President Calvin Coolidge on Dec. 13, 1923, to advocate for tribal sovereignty, in addition to other artifacts that belonged to her, are on display there, but we unfortunately were unable to see the exhibit due to another group occupying the artifact room for a long while. We'll save it for our next trip! As a side note, on Dec. 21, 2023, the Cherokee Nation (which Amy, Caleb, Aden, and several other Muskrat family members are registered citizens of) officially declared Dec. 13 to be "Ruth Muskrat Bronson Day," which marked the centennial anniversary of her activist visit with President Coolidge. Amy's grandfather, aunt, and several other relatives were in attendance for the commemorative occasion.



Another highlight of the year included caring for our sweet Noelle's nine puppies. It was an incredible experience to witness the miracle of the precious puppies' births in mid-September, and we enjoyed taking caring of them for almost ten weeks. It was a lot of hard work but worth every minute and puppy snuggle! We found loving homes for eight of the puppies and decided to keep a lilac merle male, Pappy van Winkle (aka Pappy, Paps, Papster). He and Noelle are already instant playmates!

We still have our six Black Australorp chickens and have enjoyed gifting fresh eggs to family, friends, and neighbors. Because the chickens ate all of our backyard grass after free-ranging for over a year, we decided to put them in a penned-in chicken run in the Fall to help our grass grow back. Noelle still circles the entire pen, "herding" the chickens, and Pappy is quickly catching on as well.
